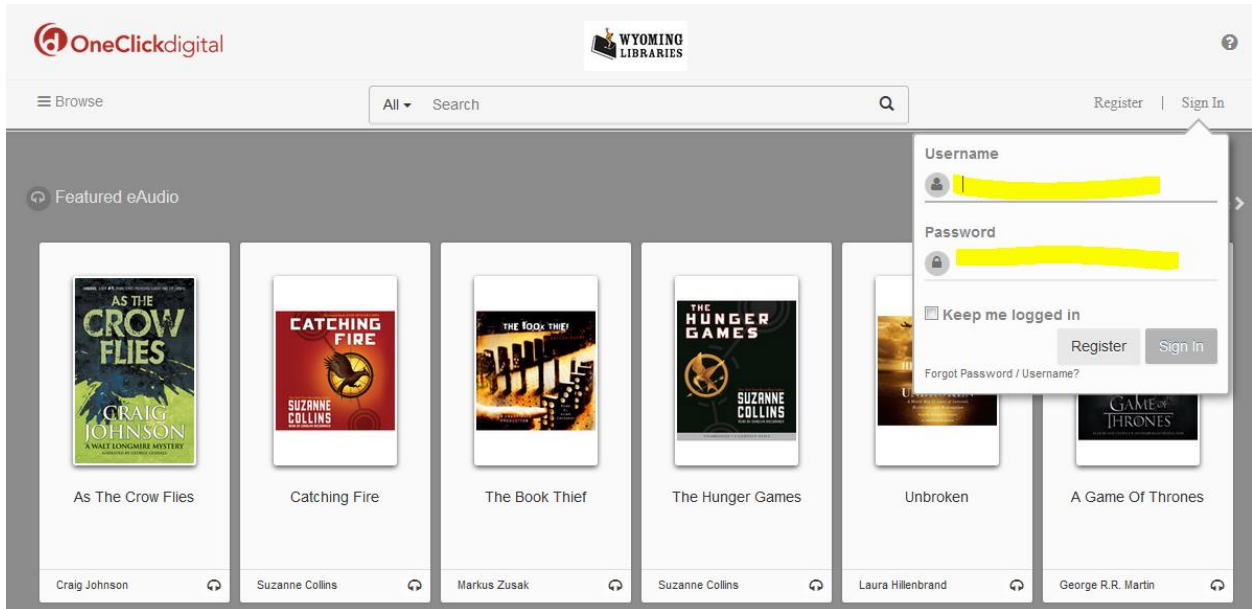


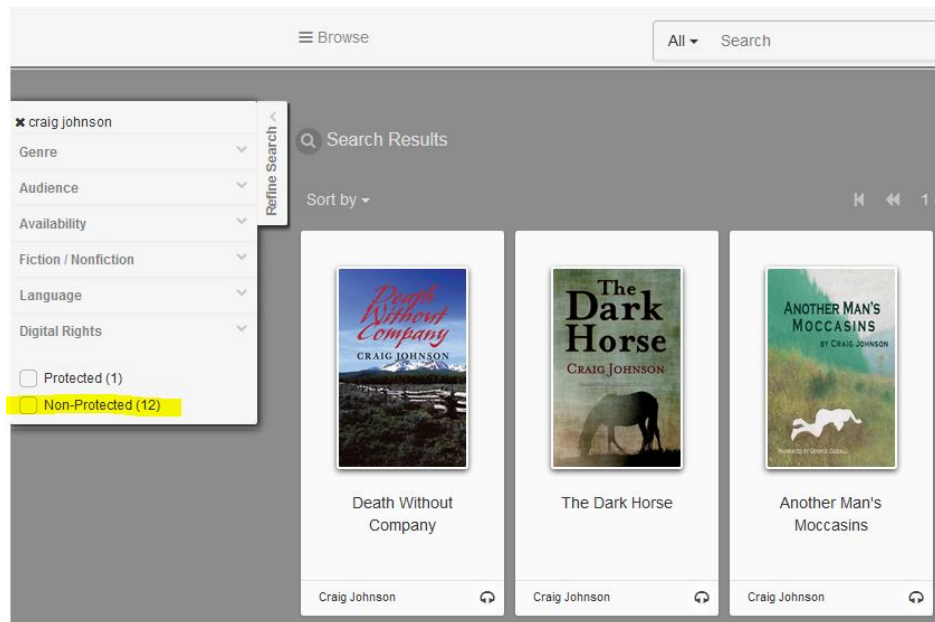
Saving searches on the OneClickdigital site for later use.

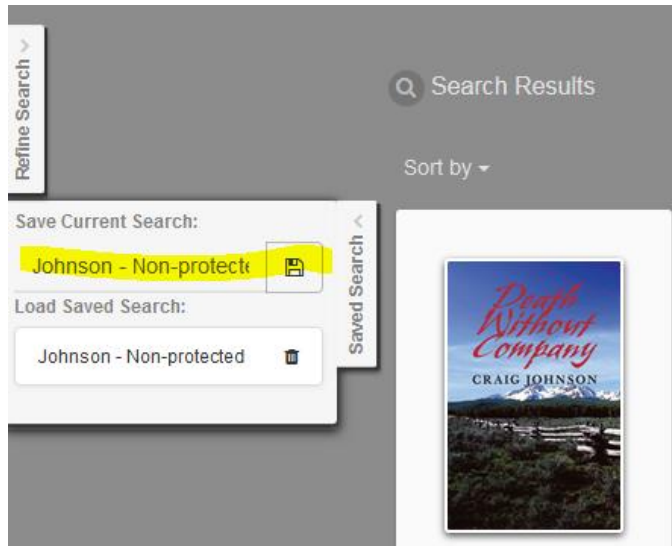
Logged in users can save the options used in any search in OneClickdigital

*Saving searches may be particularly useful for users who must limit to non-protected content to transfer to WMA enabled devices.

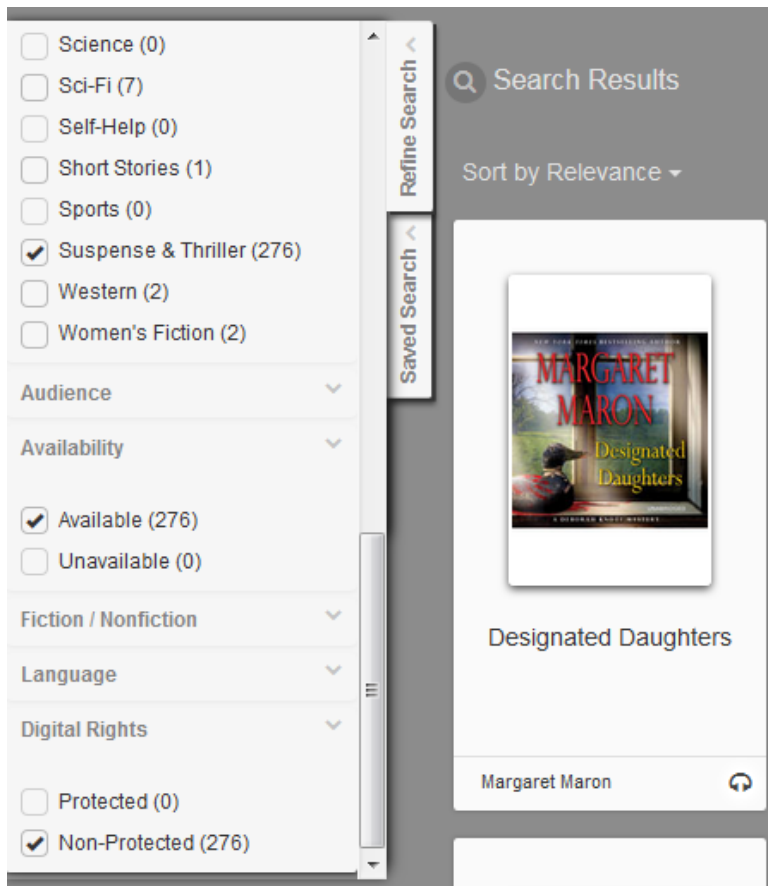


After logging in, a search such as author = Craig Johnson will show a vertical tab on the left labeled 'Refine Search' Select options such as Digital Rights to further limit the search to Non-protected content only.





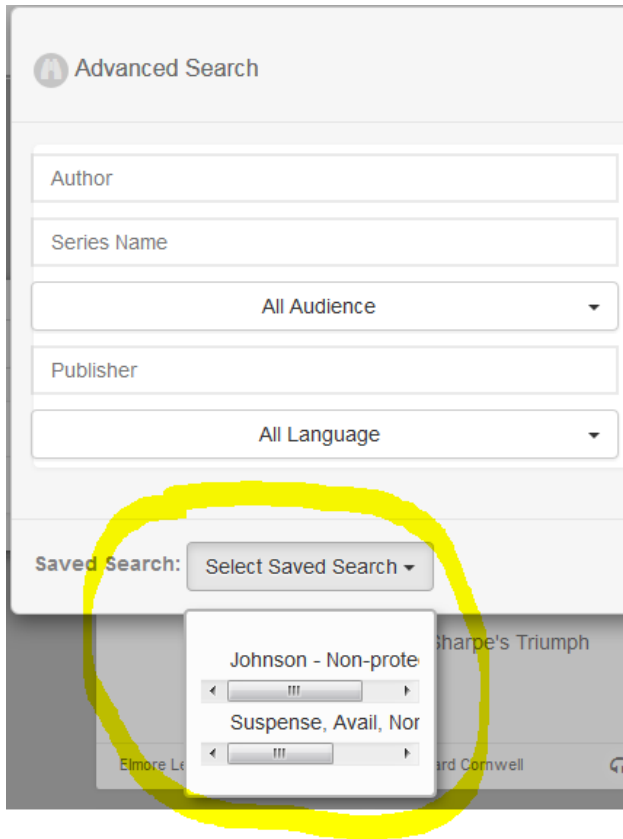
The screen will refresh with results for only the non-protected files. Save the search by clicking on the other vertical tab labeled 'Saved Search', give it a name, then click the save icon.



Searches can be saved from almost any screen except the Bestsellers, Most Popular, Newly Added, and featured eAudio screens.

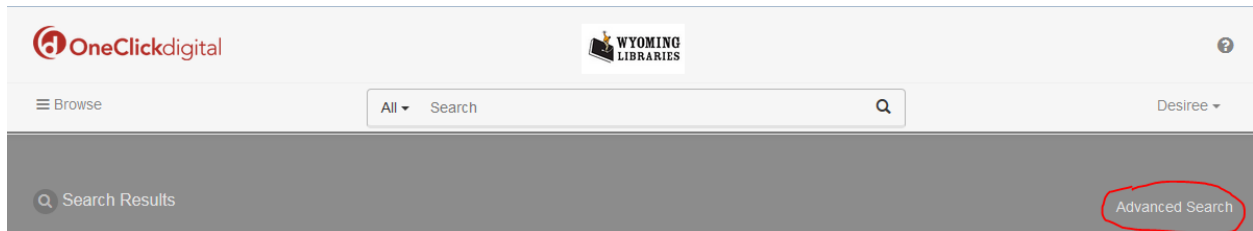
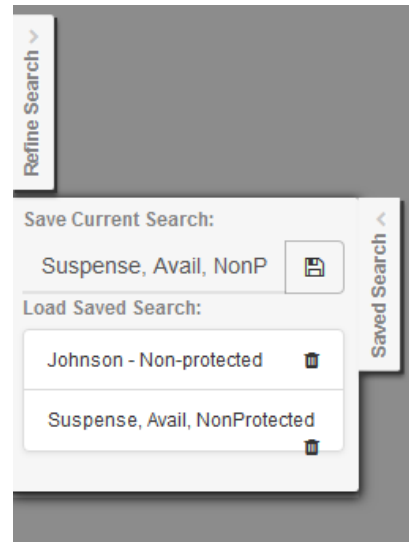
Any genre search can be saved as well as any keyword search with any options selected. A user could even search 'All' titles in the collection and then add limits for availability, digital rights, etc.

The example at left shows a genre search for Suspense & Thriller limited to Available and Non-protected.

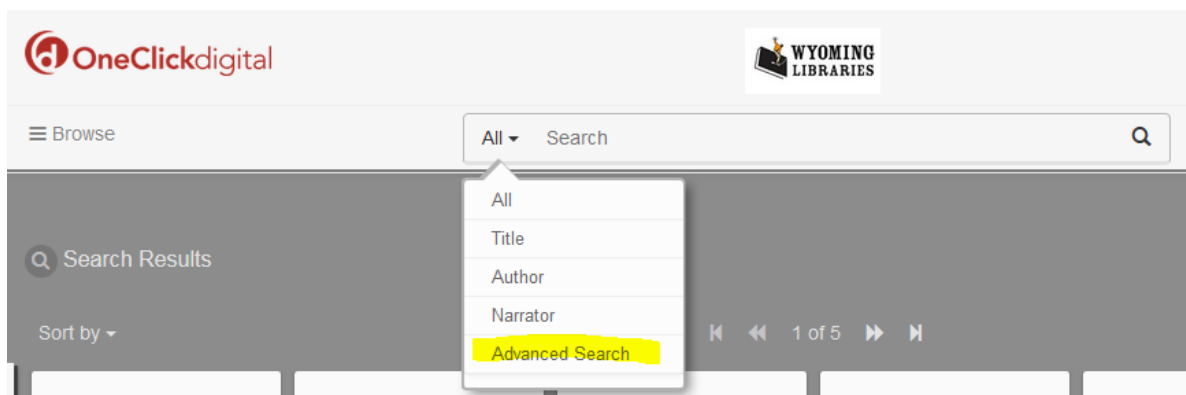


Saved searches can be accessed from the Advanced Search screen or from any search results screen.

*Advanced search is linked on the home page, any search result page and from the search menu (click on 'All' to see the other search options.)

Searches remain saved to a user account indefinitely. To delete a saved search, click on the saved search tab, and then click on the trash can icon to the right of the saved search.
